Year 4 Newsletter



This term we will be focusing our learning around the topic of Ancient Egypt.

We have lots of fun art and science activities to do. We know this will be a fantastic term!

Our learning this term

Maths – This term we are learning to multiply and divide two and three-digit numbers by a one-digit number. We will then move on to fractions and decimals. As always, we will continue using our skills to problem solve and develop reasoning skills.

By the end of Year 4 we aim for all children to know all their multiplication facts. Due to the importance of these skills, we would appreciate your help in supporting your child to learn their tables at home. Teachers will set regular tasks on TTRS and along with reading this will form the main home learning each week. We are continuing to learn all our times tables. Well done if you are already scoring 25/25 consistently on TTRS soundchecks.

English– We are concentrating on writing Narratives, Leaflets and Reports, as well as exploring Poetry. As a Year 4 pupil, the children will be learning to use several grammar features confidently including: fronted adverbials, possessive apostrophes, writing in paragraphs and using conjunctions to form different sentence types. This term we will also be focused on using inverted commas (speech marks) accurately.

Other subjects – History will make up a large part of our Thematic work this term. We will focus on learning about Ancient Egypt. In science, we will be learning about sound. In this unit, we will be learning about how vibrations travel to create sound, and the structure of the ear. Next half term, we will focus on Electricity. In French, children have enjoyed learning the names of fruit and vegetables. Now we are focusing on learning phrases related to ourselves and our classrooms.

In the morning, adults will be focused on greeting children on the door and supporting them in their morning work during morning drop off. They will not be able to discuss queries at the start of the day.

Reading is a vital skill for learning at White Hall Academy and in later life. The best readers are those who read outside of school and talk about what they have read. Many of the Year 4 pupils are confident readers and can read independently at home. However, it is still important to ask them questions about their reading to support their understanding.

We expect children to read at least three times each week at home. Ideally, they should read every day and record each session in their reading record books, writing the pages read and short additional comments about any tricky or interesting parts of the text.
