Our learning this half term

To start off this year we have an exciting focus topic. Our theme for the Autumn term is 'Rainforests'; within this topic we will learn about South American rainforests and the Mayan civilization.

Maths – Year 4 will be working to develop fluency, problem solving and reasoning skills. This term we will be focusing on reasoning with numbers and then working with the four operations. Rehearsing times table fluency at home will really help your child in all areas of maths.

Children will be encouraged to develop their knowledge of the times tables. By the end of Year 4, all children should know all their multiplication facts. In July, Year Four pupils, will participate in a National Multiplication Check. Due to the importance of these skills, we would appreciate your help in supporting your child to learn their tables at home. Teachers will set regular tasks on TTRS and along with reading this will form the main home learning each week.

English– We are concentrating on writing narratives (stories) and non-chronological reports. As a Year 4 pupil, the children will be learning to use several grammar features confidently including: fronted adverbials, possessive apostrophes, writing in paragraphs and using conjunctions to form different sentence types. There will also be a focus on handwriting and spelling patterns.

Other subjects – History will make up a large part of our Thematic work this term. We will learn about the Mayan civilization and their way of life, as we develop our historical skill of looking at evidence. In Geography and Science, we will continue our link with the rainforest, studying threats as well as looks at distribution of natural resources. We will also learn about classification of living things both from our local area and the rainforest.

'Learning to Learn' - We are continuing to promote Growth Mindset skills which help us to learn: determination, effort and never giving up! Through the learning of a new skill children will also develop their reflection skills and begin to identify different ways to become better learners in future.

Reading

In school, each class will have a novel that they read daily together. This half term 4B are reading Grimwood, 4J are reading Kensuke's Kingdom and 4W are reading Llama Out Loud. We hope the children will share their knowledge of these novels at home.

Reading is a vital skill for learning at White Hall Academy and in later life. The best readers are those who read outside of school and talk about what they have read. Many of the Year 4 pupils are confident readers and can read independently at home. However, it is still important to listen to your child read aloud and to ask them questions about their reading to support their understanding.

Some children within Year 4, who are still developing their confidence and fluency with reading, will have a levelled reading book. These will be **changed once a week**, provided the child has read and understood their book. We expect children to read at least three times each week at home, recording the pages read and a short additional comment about any tricky or interesting parts of the text.

School Expectations

REMINDER

White Hall Academy is a Nut-Free school, so please ensure all lunch box items and snacks are nut free. We do have pupils in our school with severe allergies.

Drinks

Children should bring a named bottle **with water** to school. These can be refilled during the school day. This is the best liquid to keep your child hydrated and enable them to learn effectively. Having juice brought into school attracts ants and results in time being lost when spillages need to be cleaned up by staff. If your child brings a packed lunch, they can bring a separate juice bottle or carton in their lunch box to take into the lunch hall.

Snacks

Children may bring their own healthy snack for break time, preferably fruit or vegetables. Cheese sticks, yogurt and fruit-based cereals bars are also acceptable.

We want to ensure all children develop positive relationships with the adults in their class, as we know this will support their learning.

To encourage this, adults will be focused on greeting children on the door and supporting them in their morning work during morning drop off. They will not be able to discuss queries at the start of the day. Short messages about collection arrangements can be called to the office or messaged via Dojo.

Uniform

Children need to wear correct uniform to school each day. Please clearly label your child's uniform.
