Message from the Head

Dear Parents and Carers,

What a busy half first half term we have had! The first seven weeks of the school year have flown by, and the last two weeks have been no exception.

I would first like to congratulate **Eden Pearson in Year 5.** Eden has been given a permanent position at the Colchester UTD Emerging Talent Centre for Football, where she now progresses towards the England Talent Pathways as a Goalkeeper. This is an amazing achievement and we are incredibly proud of Eden and can't wait to see what she achieves in the future.

On Wednesday, we had the Two Johns visit us from EST Safety. They led assemblies with our Key Stage 2 children about the risks of the online world. It was a shock to ourselves and the Two Johns, how many of our children have been exposed to adult content online. Please talk to your children about what they learnt from these sessions, and what steps they can take to protect themselves and to enjoy the Internet safetly. The Two Johns run a Facebook page (EST Safety) which has a plethora of advice for Parents and Carers and recommend spending some time reading their content.

Our Girls Football team had their first match yesterday against Engaines. I am proud to say that the girls won 8-4! What an amazing start to their football season. Please see page 3 for the report.

After half term, all children in Key Stage 2 (Years 3-6) will be taking part in swimming lessons. The swimming lessons will take place on the school site as it did last year. Children will require to bring to school a one piece swimming costume for girls or fitted swimming trunks for boys, a towel, swimming hat (all children are required to wear one, we have a small number of spares the children can wear if they do not have their own), footwear to wear to the pool (such as flip flops / crocs), children may wear a dressing gown if they wish whilst walking from the changing pods to the swimming pool. Details of when your child will be swimming and which group will be posted by your child's class teacher on their class story on ClassDojo.

On Wednesday 15th November, we will be hosting our Termly Learning Conferences. This is an opportunity for you to see your child's learning and to discuss their progress with their class teacher. You will be able to book appointments via ClassDojo from **Monday 30th October**.

Please note that poppies are available for children to purchase for a small monetary donation until **Friday 10th November**. If your child would like a poppy, please send them to school with a small donation.

I would like to remind parents/carers that if you wish to use the Wraparound provision, please ensure you have completed the online form in order to secure your child's place via the link provided.—This must be completed the day before you require the provision. 

Brightly coloured or fluorescent clothing shows up well in daylight and at dusk when you're heading to and from school.

If you're out and about when it's dark wear reflective items to make sure you can be seen in car headlights. Reflective vests, sashes or wristbands work well. Remember, fluorescent clothing doesn't work after dark!

- 3 Don't forget to accessorise! Even small items such as clip on reflectors, armbands and stickers on your outfit or school bag are a great way to improve your visibility.
- If you like to cycle, remember that it's the law to have clean and working lights at night (white at the front, red at the back), as well as a rear reflector. It's good to fit spoke reflectors too.
- 5 Of course, 'Being Bright' helps drivers to see you but that won't guarantee that you keep safe. You still need to make sure that you stop and look in all directions for traffic every time you cross.
