Reading

In school, each class will have a novel that they read daily together. This half term 4B are reading Llama Out Loud, 4W are reading Grimwood and 4G are reading The Wild Robot. We hope the children will share their knowledge of these novels at home.

Reading is a vital skill for learning at White Hall Academy and in later life. The best readers are those who read outside of school and talk about what they have read.

By year Four, most children should be secure on their phonics knowledge and able to read longer books independently. Wherever your child is on their reading journey, it is still important to listen to your child read aloud and to ask them questions about their reading to support their understanding. Some children within Year 4, who are still developing their confidence and fluency with reading, will have a levelled phonics reading book. These will be **changed once a week**, provided the child has read and understood their book.

We expect children to **read at least three times each week at home**, recording the pages read and a short additional comment about any tricky or interesting parts of the text.

Our learning this half term

To start off this year we have an exciting focus topic. Our theme for the Autumn term is 'UK countries, cities and regions'; within this topic we will learn about the UK in more detail and we will develop our mapping skills.

Maths – Year 4 will be working to develop fluency, problem solving and reasoning skills. This term we will be focusing on reasoning with numbers and then working with the four operations.

Children will be encouraged to develop their knowledge of the times tables. By the end of Year 4, all children should know all their multiplication facts. In July, Year Four pupils will participate in a National Multiplication Check. Due to the importance of these skills, we would appreciate your help in supporting your child to learn their tables at home. Teachers will set regular tasks on TTRS and along with reading this will form the main home learning each week.

English– To begin the Year we will continue our new programme in school called 'Writing For Pleasure'. We will be learning about the structure and features within Non-chronological reports before writing our own. Over the year, pupils will be learning to use several grammar features confidently including: fronted adverbials, possessive apostrophes, writing in paragraphs and using conjunctions to form different sentence types. There will also be a focus on handwriting and spelling patterns.

Other subjects – In Science, we will be learning to group and classify animals before moving on to learn about states of matter and the water cycle. In art, we will be learning about different forms and will be using a range of materials to make 3D structures. In the first half term, we will be learning about Judaism in RE and will be learning about Christianity and the nativity story in the second half of the term. We will be learning how to live healthy lifestyles and about cultivating relationships in our PSHE lessons.

White Hall Academy is a Nut-Free school, so please ensure all lunch box items and snacks are nut free. We do have pupils in our school with severe allergies.

Drinks

Children should bring a named bottle **with water** to school. These can be refilled during the school day. This is the best liquid to keep your child hydrated and enable them to learn effectively. Having juice brought into school attracts ants and results in time being lost when spillages need to be cleaned up by staff. If your child brings a packed lunch, they can bring a separate juice bottle or carton in their lunch box to take into the lunch hall.

Snacks

Children may bring their own healthy snack for break time, preferably fruit or vegetables. Cheese sticks, yogurt and fruit-based cereals bars are also acceptable.

Uniform

Children need to wear correct uniform to school each day. Please clearly label your child's uniform.
